The statutory guidance re-issued in August 2015 states that the governing Body should publish this register in the interests of transparency. ### Definitions

**Staff Governor:** Teaching and support staff who, at the time of election, are employed by either the governing body or the local authority to work at the school under a contract of employment, are eligible to be staff governors. Staff governors are elected by the school staff. They cease to hold office when they cease to work at the school.

**Parent Governor:** Parent governors are elected by other parents at the school. Any parent, or carer, of a registered pupil at the school at the time of election is eligible to stand for election as a parent governor. Parent governors may continue to hold office until the end of their term of office even if their child leaves the school.

**Foundation Governor:** Foundation governors are either appointed or take the role by virtue of an office (**Ex Officio**) that they hold. They may be appointed by the school's founding body such as a church or other organisation for the purpose of securing that the school's character (including religious character where it has one) is preserved and developed; and

- that the school is conducted in accordance with the foundation's governing documents.

**LA Governor:** Local authority governors are nominated by the local authority but appointed by the governing body.

**Co-opted Governor:** Co-opted governors are appointed by the governing body. They are people who in the opinion of the governing body have the skills required to contribute to the effective governance and success of the school.

**Associate Members:** Associate members are appointed by the governing body to serve on one or more governing body committee. They may also attend full governing body meetings. They are not governors and therefore do not have a vote in governing body decisions, but may be given a vote on decision made by committees to which they are appointed.
